Therefore, take notice that the Code Enforcement Board will hear the recommendation that a lien in the amount of \$6,319.04 be placed on the property for the cost of abatement of the nuisance and all incidental costs of enforcement, and that a lien of \$1,000.00 be placed on the property pursuant to fines imposed for noncompliance. This second order may be recorded in the public records of Bay County and thereafter shall constitute a lien against the subject property and upon any other real or personal property you own. After the lien is imposed, the County may assess the reasonable cost of abating the violation against the property pursuant to the Uniform Assessment Collect Act and Chapter 21 of Bay County Code. If the County adopts the assessment against the property, the portion of the lien that constitutes the reasonable cost of abatement shall be released.
